

Montale's Hydrangeas - oakleaf, Annabelle-types, and mop-head

quercifolia variety

(Oakleaf Hydrangea)

Can thrive in dryer locations than its cousins

Does not like "wet feet"

Needs little maintenance

Blooms on old wood - prune immediately after flowering

Sun to partial shade ♦♦

Blooms in Summer

arborescens varieties

('Annabelle' and 'Incrediball' hydrangea)

Average soil

Flowers are great for winter interest

Prune back to 12" in spring.

Sun to partial shade ♦♦

Blooms in Summer

Blooms best in full sun to partial shade

macrophylla and serrata varieties

(mophead, bigleaf hydrangea, lacecap hydrangea)

Moist soils

Avoid late afternoon sun.

Stems often die to the ground in winter,
but all our varieties bloom on new growth.

Prune in spring.

Sun to partial shade — moist soils

Mid-day sun for best blooming.
